Diabetes	Potentially serious consequences of diabetes if wrong foods or drink consumed	Pupils Staff	Medium	Insulin may be carried and correctly stored for pupils with this diagnosis with a prescription		
Eczema	Skin irritation when encountering a triggering substance	Pupils Staff	Low	Consider activities that could worsen or cause infections to pupils with eczema, for instance waterborne activities, farm visits or hot weather conditions Staff to be aware of pre-known condition and triggers
