Aims of this Policy

A young person's career is their pathway through both learning and work. Cheltenham College is committed to providing careers education, advice, information and guidance through a stable HE and Careers programme for all pupils in the EYFS through to Upper Sixth Form; through individual academic departments and through the PSHE Floreat programme.

We aim:

To provide a stable structured careers programme that is tailored to the needs of pupils that promotes equal opportunities and challenges
stereotypical thinking and attitudes
To ensure every pupil has access to high-quality information about future study options and labour market information in order to support all pupils in achieving their full potential
To ensure that all pupils understand the full range of learning opportunities that are available to them. This includes both academic and technical and
vocational routes and learning in schools, colleges, universities and in the workplace.

To prepare all pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life and work through opportunities to learn from employers about work
employment and skills
To provide 1:1 impartial advice and guidance through career guidance interviews to all pupils whenever significant study or career choices are being
made

Objectives

The careers programme and guidance is designed to meet the needs of all pupils at Cheltenham College. It is differentiated to ensure that activities are age-appropriate to pupils' stages of career learning, planning and development.

Implementation at College

Cheltenham College recognises the need for pupils to have access to accurate, up-to-date, further and higher education and careers guidance. The guidance provided seeks to ensure the following:-

- a) That the advice is presented in an impartial manner
- b) That the information given will enable pupils to make informed choices about a broad range of further and higher education and career options
- c) That the advice given will encourage pupils to fulfil their potential.

A range of activities is provided by the HE and Careers programme for pupils from Third Form to Upper Sixth and these are summarized below.

Work Experience

Any member of staff who wishes to recommend a contact (personal or otherwise) to a pupil for the purpose of work experience, must in the first instance, pass on the contact's name, details, place of work and the name of the pupil to RME.

In order for College to remain compliant in the organisation of work experience placements, RME will adhere to the work experience protocol to arrange the placement with the contact, liaise with parents/ guardians, create a risk assessment for the duration of the placement and ensure that all Health and Safety and Insurance policies cover young people in the work place.

Implementation at Cheltenham Prep

The careers programme is put together by a variety of senior staff at Cheltenham Prep, and includes the Deputy Head (Academic), Deputy Head (Pastoral), Assistant Head (responsible for the Thrive/PSHE/RSE programme) and Heads of Section.

It includes careers education lessons, careers guidance activities, information and research, visits from and to employers and our Chadwick Leadership programme in Year 8. Careers lessons feature as part of the curriculum in EYFS and Lower School, and as part of Thrive (PSHE/RSE) lessons in Years 5-8.
